## **STATEMENT**

My work can be divided into two thematic complexes. I see both as interconnected. On the one hand, I am interested in the digitalisation of relationships and communication. The enormous amount of available data, the speed of information flows and the question of the authenticity of what is shown are recurring themes in my work. On the other hand, my works deal with the spatial proximity of ethnic, religious and ecological systems. Globalisation, migration and climate change – buzzwords that neverthless produce literally complex landscapes. The diverse and far-reaching effects of an interconnected, mutually influencing life on this planet often become visible in these landscapes through small, everyday moments.

Conceiving performances or performing myself is an inherent part of my artistic practice. In addition, my works can also take the form of video essays, installations and combinations of these.

My performative concepts are score-based, which means they work with a set of rules or agreements to which the involved performers react, fill and interpret. I work with gestures, movements and choral elements. Overlapping and casualness characterise the processes – performers and their voices, but also objects and the attending visitors take up the space on an equal footing. It is important to me to create objects and performative settings that function sensually. Objects and settings that want to come into contact, that function not only for the eye but at best for more than one sense or for the whole body.

The consideration of site- and people-specific circumstances are often part of the work's development, as well as the use of found or user-generated material.

CLOSER is a serial, cross-format work that follows different stories based on the polyphonic format of the telenovela. Individual and collective narratives combine contradictions, myths and experiences. CLOSER is weaving a fictional web between human and non-human protagonists. Coastal erosion and migration play a role, as do accounting and mango puree.

So far, an installation, the Prologue and Episode I (both video-based) and Episode II (performance) have been created. A total of about 10 episodes will be produced. The individual episodes are not exclusively cinematic, but also take on an installative or performative form.

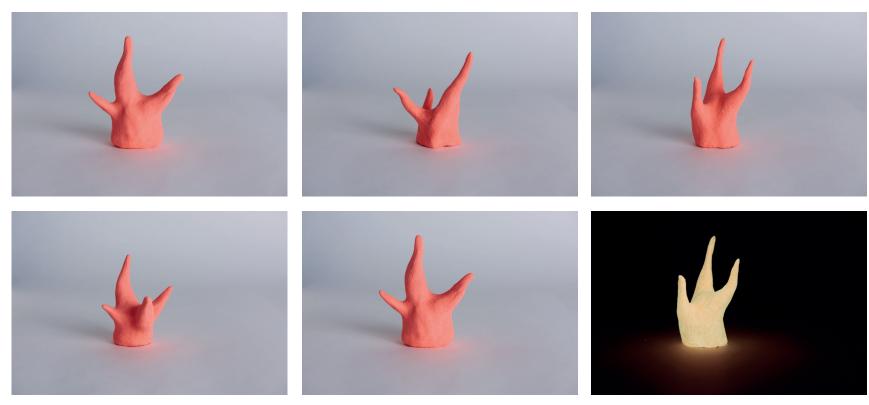

Where do masses form? How can you perceive them? How does a mass organise space?

The performance begins without announcement. Casually and by means of gestures, movements and choral elements, 50 performers permanently re-form. They create units through movements and proximity. They distribute small-format objects with codes in the outside space. They create a synchronous, increasing sound with manufactured rings. They use necklaces as (self-)identification within the mass of the audience. They whisper and shout chorally.
